I have been working my way through the series for 3 years. I have yet to figure the answer out before the end of the book!



A mythological based fantasy using African Myth-all my favorite things!



Beautifully written story of a friendship.





Harder to read than you think, they are our favorite characters taking on evil and sometimes social issues that we need to discuss.







A great love story nicely tied up by the time you finish the series. Not overly cliche, sweetly done.







Real life advice and realistic stories told through poetry



After finishing you will have give it to your friends so that you can discuss the ending!




Simon vs. The Homo Sapiens Agenda

After seeing the movie, I wanted to get the full story. There were moments I didn't love Simon, but this was a real and lovely love story.



The fact that this is based on real events is heartbreaking (as historical fiction tends to be). Jumping between past and present gave us a mystery to solve.



Julie Murphy writes honest and real characters that you want to be friends with!






World War II historical fiction showing the strength of the women in France.





I LOVE Bachman's writing-his phrasing and character development are exquisite. This is a story about hockey. And a town. And a family. And I didn't want it to end.



Another Ms. McKinzie recommendation, kind of like CSI and The Breakfast Club.


