


Why I liked them:


Saying you are not racist is not the same as being antiracist. Both books educate you and encourage change.


Why I liked it:


The Girl in The Letter Emily Gunnis


Why I liked it:

Deep Kindness Houston Kraft


Why I liked it:


Why I liked it: Just a fun read. Recommended by the APHS Book Club

Why I liked it: I am a dystopian junkie. This was an interesting perspective because of the discussions of gender and power.





with me.






Why I liked it: That whole section of poems inspired by *Abby Road*.


Clap When You Land Elizabeth Acevedo

Why I liked it: A really intriguing story told in poetic verse.




Furia Yamile Saied Mendez

Why I liked it: Female empowerment. Futbol. A love story.




The Midnight Library
